See the different example files. Then add your extended abstract in the `extendedAbstract` environment. The bibliography has to be written in this file in the `thebibliography` environment. You can use as usual environments `theorem`, `proposition`, `lemma`, `property`, `corollary`, `conjecture`, `example`, `problem`. For examples:

**Theorem 1 (Authors 'Year [6])** *Statement.*

**Conjecture 2** *Statement.*

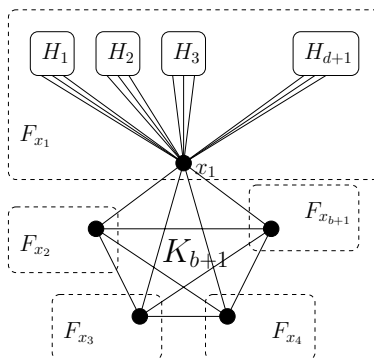


Figure 1: The graph  $G_{d,a,b}$

If you want to insert figures, then insert figures with `.eps` format as follows (see Figure 1):
